
1. God Has Given Us the Place of Adult Children in His Family.




(Rom. 8:14) For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God.




(Rom. 8:15) For <mark>ye</mark> have not received the **spirit of bondage** (slave) again to fear;




(Rom. 8:15) ...but <mark>ye</mark> have received the **Spirit** of adoption (become adult-son of God), whereby (that is how) <mark>we</mark> cry, **Abba, Father**.





"Abba, Father" = The Spirit leads us into having a near relationship with the Father (Rom. 8:16) The **Spirit** itself beareth witness (tells true) with our spirit, that we are the children of God:

The Spirit gives us assurance (know).



(Rom. 8:17) And if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ; if so be that we suffer with him (Jesus), that we may be also glorified together.

*A man shares his land and money with his children... same does God with us. *Jesus is like the eldest son.



2. We Will Enjoy Our Wonderful Home in Heaven.



(Rom. 8:18) For I reckon (believe) that the sufferings of this present (now) time are not worthy (good) to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed (shown) in US.



(Rom. 8:19) For the <u>earnest</u> (much) <u>expectation</u> (hope) of the creature (all creation) waiteth for the manifestation (show[glorification]) of the sons of God.






(Rom. 8:20) For the creature (all creation) was made subject to vanity (bad-waste), not willingly (free choose), but by reason (because) of <u>him who</u> (God) hath subjected (put under) the same in hope (look—future),



(Gen. 3:17) "...cursed (bad) is the ground for thy (Adam's) sake (reason... why); in <u>sorrow</u> (hurt/sad) shalt thou eat of it all the days of thy life;







(Rom. 8:21) Because the creature (all creation) itself also shall be delivered (saved) from the <u>bondage of corruption</u> (vanity[bad]) into the glorious liberty (freedom) of the children of God.



(Rom. 8:22) For we know that the whole creation groaneth (sad) and <u>travaileth</u> <u>in pain</u> (suffer) together until now.




(Rom. 8:23) And not only they (all creation), but ourselves [are suffering] also, which have the firstfruits (promise of future good) of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan (sad) within ourselves, waiting for the adoption (receive all inheritance), to wit (know-make clear), the redemption (saving/glorification) of our body.



(Rom. 8:24) For we are saved by hope (faith): but hope that is seen is not hope: for what a man seeth, why doth he yet hope for? (25) But if we hope for that we see not, then do we with patience wait for it (glorification).



3. The Holy Spirit Prays for Us.




(Rom. 8:26) Likewise (same) the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities (weak): for we know not what we should pray for as we ought (need): but the Spirit itself maketh intercession (prayer) for us with groanings (sound) which cannot be uttered (speak).

> As we patiently wait for our glorification, the Spirit helps us.



I cant say it in words.. Can you please just (27) And <mark>he (God)</mark> that searcheth the hearts knoweth what is the mind of the **Spirit**, because he (the Spirit) maketh intercession (prays) for the saints according to the will (want) of **God**.



4. God's Good Plan for Us.



(Rom. 8:28) And we know that all things work together (result) for good to them that love God, to them who are the called (Gospel) according to his (God's) purpose (plan).

God makes everything in our lives result in the completion of His good plan for us.



(Rom. 8:29) For whom (believers) he (God) did foreknow (before know), he also did predestinate (before plan) to be conformed (made) to the image (same) of his Son, that he (Son) might be the firstborn (#1 / eldest) among many brethren.

God is making us to become like Jesus with all the different things that happen to us.



Before God created the world, God began planning for us to become like Jesus.



Jesus is the "firstborn" (#1)
*God gave Jesus the office of "firstborn"
because Jesus is the <u>Eternal Son</u>.
*Jesus is firstborn because Jesus is the <u>Leader</u>
of all God's children—Jesus is our Elder Brother.


(Rom. 8:30) Moreover (and) whom (believers) he (God) did predestinate (before plan), them he also called (gave Gospel): and whom he called, them he also justified (made right): and whom he justified, them he also glorified (give all good things).

God Promises that all He planned for us Will Happen.



(Rom. 8:30)


"predestinate": <u>Before</u> God made the world, <u>God planned</u> to make us like Jesus *"called"*: God <u>called us with the Gospel</u> to trust in Jesus for salvation.




(Rom. 8:30)

"justified": When we trusted in Jesus, God forgave all our sins <u>making us righteous.</u>

"glorified" When Jesus takes us to Heaven, the curse (bad) and all sin will forever be removed. We will <u>share all things with God.</u>




5. God Will Always Take Care of Us.




(Rom. 8:31) What shall we then say to these things? If <mark>God</mark> be for (helps) <mark>us</mark>, who can be against (hurt) <mark>us</mark>?

Because God helps us, no person and nothing can destroy us.





(Rom. 8:32) *He (God)* that spared (keep) not his (God's) **own <mark>Son</mark>, but delivered** (gave) him up for us all, how shall <mark>he (God)</mark> not with <mark>him</mark> <mark>(Jesus)</mark> also **freely give <mark>us</mark> all** things?



God has already given us His Best (Jesus dying on the cross for our sins), so we can trust that all we need God will give to us. (Rom. 8:33) Who <u>shall lay any thing to</u> <u>the charge (condemn) of **God's** elect</u> (chosen)? It is **God** that justifieth (says, Right).


No person can condemn us before God.





(Rom. 8:35) Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? shall tribulation (problems), or distress (tired/sad), or persecution (attack), or famine (no food), or nakedness (no clothes / house), or peril (danger), or sword (kill/death)? ...

Nothing can separate us from God's love.



(37) Nay (no), in all these things we are more than conquerors (winners) through him (Jesus) that loved <mark>us</mark>. (38) For I am persuaded (believe), that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities (rulers), nor powers, nor things present (now), nor things to come (future), (39) Nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate <mark>us</mark> from the love of <mark>God</mark>, which is in <mark>Christ Jesus our Lord</mark>.
