
1. Paul's Third Missionary Journey.






(Acts 18:23) After Paul stayed in Antioch for some time, Paul returned to **Galatia** and **Phrygia** to make strong the new churches.







2. Paul Went to Ephesus.



(Acts 19:1-8) In **Ephesus** Paul taught and argued in the <u>Jews synagogue</u> for three months.




(Acts 19:9) Some Jews did not want Paul to continue teaching them. *Paul separated the disciples (believers) from the unbelieving Jews and began teaching God's Word in a school daily.



(Acts 19:10) Paul continued teaching in **Ephesus [**Asia**]** for <u>two years</u>. All people both Jews and Greeks heard


the Gospel.






(Acts 19:11-12) God did many miracles through Paul. Paul healed the sick and cast out demons.

*This was great proof that Paul was God's servant/apostle.




In Ephesus Paul wrote <u>1 Corinthians</u> to the church in Corinth (1 Cor. 16:8). *Paul was trying* to solve church problems.





(Acts 19:13-14) Some Jews tried to copy Paul and cast out demons.




(Acts 19:15-16) The demons knew Jesus and Paul, but they did not know these Jews. These Jews were liars and had no power from God.

*The man with the demons attacked.



(Acts 19:17) When all the people heard about this, feared (great respect) for Jesus and Paul.



(Acts 19:18-20) Many believed in Jesus. They proved their faith by burning their idols and magic books.



(Acts 19:23-25) Ephesus had a large temple to the goddess, Diana.
*They made many idols and sold them to tourists/worshippers. They made much money.




(Acts 19:26-27) Paul taught idols are false gods and turned many people away from idols.


*People stopped worshipping idols there was much loss of money—selling idols less—people became angry.

(Acts 19:28-30) Angry people cried "Great is Diana!!!" The city Ephesus was full or rioting and confusion and the people attacked Christians.




Temple of Diana - today




(Acts 20:1) After the riot stopped, Paul said bye to the many new Christians. Paul went to **Macedonia**.



3. Paul Went to Macedonia and Greece (Corinth).



(Acts 20:2) Paul visited and taught in several cities in Macedonia.




In Philippi or Thessalonica [Macedonia] Paul writes <u>2 Corinthians.</u>






(Acts 20:2-3) After Paul visited **Macedonia**, Paul went to **Corinth** [Greece] and taught the church there for <u>three months</u>.




In Corinth [Greece] Paul writes <u>Romans</u> to the church in Rome [Rom. 15:23-16:2]






Maybe in Corinth [Greece] Paul writes <u>Galatians</u> to the churches in Galatia.





4. Paul Went to Troas.




(Acts 20:6-7) In **Troas**, Paul met with the church on Sunday.



(Acts 20:7) And upon the <u>first day</u> (Sunday) of the week, when the disciples came together to <u>break</u> <u>bread</u> (Lord's Supper)...

Sunday = day Jesus rose from the dead Lord's Supper = remember Christ's sacrifice for our sins (Acts 20:9) Paul preached a very long time. A young man fell asleep and fell out a window and died.



(Acts 20:10-12) Paul and the church went down to the young man. Paul raised the man to life again.



*Paul continued to preach until the morning.
