

1. Believers' Bodies Will Be Changed



(1 Cor 15:35) But some man will say, How are the dead raised up? and with what body do they come?

(36) Thou fool, that (seed) which thou sowest (plant) is not quickened (made alive), except it (seed) <u>die</u> [death = sleep for believer... see [1 Cor. 15:51; 1 Thess. 4:14; John 11:11-13]):

Some mocked (laugh) at resurrected bodies.

God has all power. God created all things.

Only a fool doubts God's power to resurrect bodies.

Seed must die and dissolve:

(1 Cor 15:36) ...that (seed) which thou sowest (plant) is not quickened (made alive), except it die:

*Same as seed is buried and dissolves but grows into new plant, so also our bodies can be dissolved and yet become a new body.

*Same within the seed is life, so also within the believer's body is a living spirit joined with God's Spirit.



Seed becomes different grown plant:

(1 Cor 15:37) And that (seed) which thou sowest (plant) thou sowest **not** that body (grown plant) that shall be, but bare grain, it <u>may chance of</u> (maybe) wheat (food), or of some other grain (food):



- *The seed planted does not become the exact same seed, it becomes a different plant.
- *Our resurrected bodies will be different from these bodies which will die and dissolve.

God decides and gives changed bodies:

(1 Cor 15:38) But God giveth it (seed) a body (grown plant) as it hath pleased him (God), and to every seed his own body.

CPOLULIA

Same as God decided how the grown plant of a seed would be, so also God has decided how our resurrected bodies will be.

God gave different bodies to living creatures:



(1 Cor 15:39) All <u>flesh</u> (living things) is not the same flesh: but there is one <u>kind</u> (group) of flesh of **men**, <u>another</u> (group) flesh of **beasts**, another of **fishes**, and another of **birds**.

Same as God gave different bodies to living creatures, so also, He gives a different resurrected body.

God made earth different than planets of the sky

(1 Cor 15:40) There are also celestial (sky) bodies, and bodies terrestrial (earth): but the glory of the celestial is one, and the glory of the terrestrial is another.

...so also, God makes our resurrected bodies different.






All the planets, sun, moon... of the sky are different

(1 Cor 15:41) There is one glory of the **sun**, and another glory of the **moon**, and another glory of the **stars**: for one star differeth from another star in glory.

...so also, God makes resurrected bodies different



2. Resurrected Bodies Will Be Much Better



(1 Cor 15:42-43) So also is the resurrection of the dead. It (our bodies) is sown (plant) in corruption (bad—dissolve); it is raised in incorruption (good—stay same forever): (43) It is sown in dishonour (shame—yuck!); it is raised in glory (respect—beautiful): it is sown in weakness; it is raised in power:

Our bodies will die and be buried, but God will raise and change them into eternal, wonderful, and powerful bodies.

3. Natural Bodies Vs. Spiritual Bodies



(1 Cor 15:44) It is <u>sown</u> (planted/dies) a <u>natural</u> (earthly) body; it is <u>raised</u> (made alive) a <u>spiritual</u> (heavenly) body. There is a <u>natural</u> body, and there is a <u>spiritual</u> body.

Our resurrected body (spiritual—made for Heaven and eternity) will be

different than our cursed earthly body.



(1 Cor 15:45) And so it is written [Gen. 2:7], The first man Adam was made a living soul (alive); the last Adam [Jesus] was made a quickening spirit (live giving).

From Adam we inherit an earthly body and sin's curse—death.

From Jesus we inherit an eternal heavenly/spiritual body; Jesus forever gives us life—Jesus sustains our life eternally.

(1 Cor 15:46-49) Howbeit (but) that was not first which is spiritual [Jesus], but that which is natural [Adam]; and afterward (next) that which is spiritual [Jesus]. (47) The first man [Adam] is of the earth, earthy: the second man [Jesus] is the Lord from heaven [Jesus].

First was Adam with his earthly body and sin's curse—death.

Second was Jesus with His heavenly/spiritual body without sin's curse—death.


(1 Cor 15:48-49) As is the earthy [Adam], such (same) are they also that are earthy [Adam's children]: and as is the heavenly [Jesus], such (same) are they also that are heavenly (God's children). (49) And as we have borne the image (have same body) of the earthy [Adam], we shall also bear the image (have same body) of the heavenly [Jesus].

First (now) we have same as Adam's body.


Second (after) we will have same as Jesus' resurrected body.

(1 Cor 15:50) Now this I say, brethren, that flesh and blood (earthly body) cannot inherit (receive) the kingdom of God (Heaven); neither doth corruption (bad—dissolve) inherit incorruption (good—stay same forever).

Our bodies must be changed before we can enjoy Heaven and Eternity.



4. All Believers—Living and Dead—Will Be Changed



(1 Cor 15:51) Behold, I shew you a mystery (new teaching); We shall not all sleep (die), but we shall all be changed (bodies changed),

When? = "We shall not all sleep (die)"

How? = "we shall all be changed" [see vs. 52]



(1 Cor 15:52) In a moment (time), in the twinkling of an eye [very fast], at the last trump: for the trumpet shall Sound [a call for church to gather], and the dead [believers before dead] shall be raised (resurrected) incorruptible [new good, eternal bodies], and we shall be changed [all—dead and living—will receive new good eternal bodies]. (53) For this corruptible (bad) must put on (change) incorruption (good), and this mortal (dying) must <u>put on</u> (change) immortality (eternal life). (1 Cor 15:54-55) So when this corruptible (bad) shall have put on (change) incorruption (good), and this mortal (death) shall have put on (change) immortality (eternal life), then shall be (future) brought to pass (happen) the saying that is written [Isaiah 25:8; Hosea 13:14], Death is swallowed up (eaten [destroyed]) in victory (win). (55) O death, where is thy sting (power to hurt)? O grave (hell), where is thy victory?

...later we will learn about the Rapture when studying Thessalonians.

(1 Cor 15:56) The sting (power to hurt) of death is sin; and the strength of sin is the law.

Because we sin, our punishment is death.

The Law of God condemns us to death for our sin.



(1 Cor 15:57) But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

*Jesus bore our sin on the Cross—becoming sin for us.

*When Jesus died on the Cross, Jesus satisfied God's Law which demanded death for our sin.

*Jesus is God's gift to us—eternal life.



5. We Love and Serve Jesus Because Jesus Gives Us the Victory



(1 Cor 15:58) Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast (stay standing), unmoveable (not changing), always abounding (doing more and more) in the work of the Lord, forasmuch (because) as ye know that your labour (work) is not in vain (wasted) in the Lord.

"Therefore" = Because Jesus gives us the victory...

"work of the Lord" = serving Jesus

"...is **not** in vain" = is not wasted... Whether we live or die, with Jesus we have the victory.
