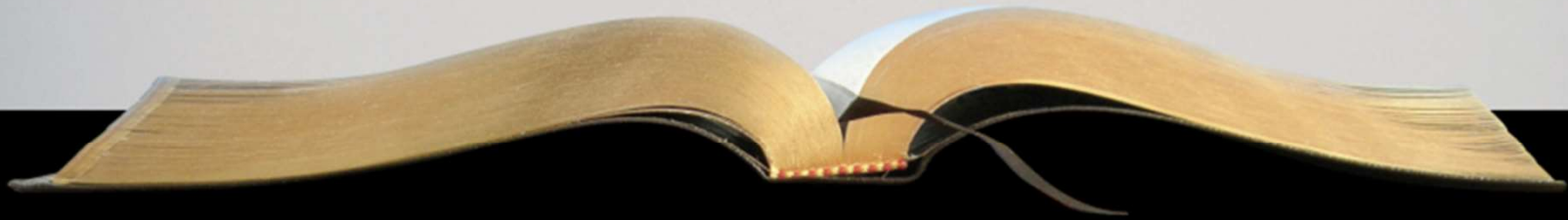

(2 Peter 1:20-21)

Prophecy = words from God

written words of God—the Bible

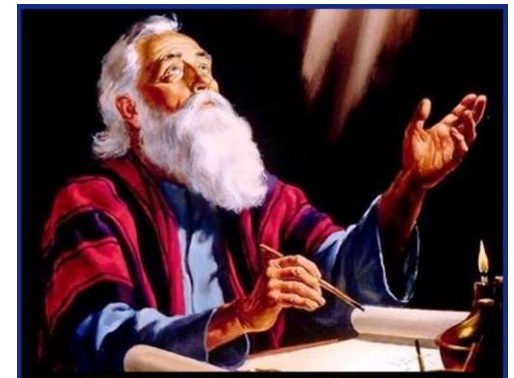

Private = man's own

Interpretation = **idea**

Will of man = man's choice



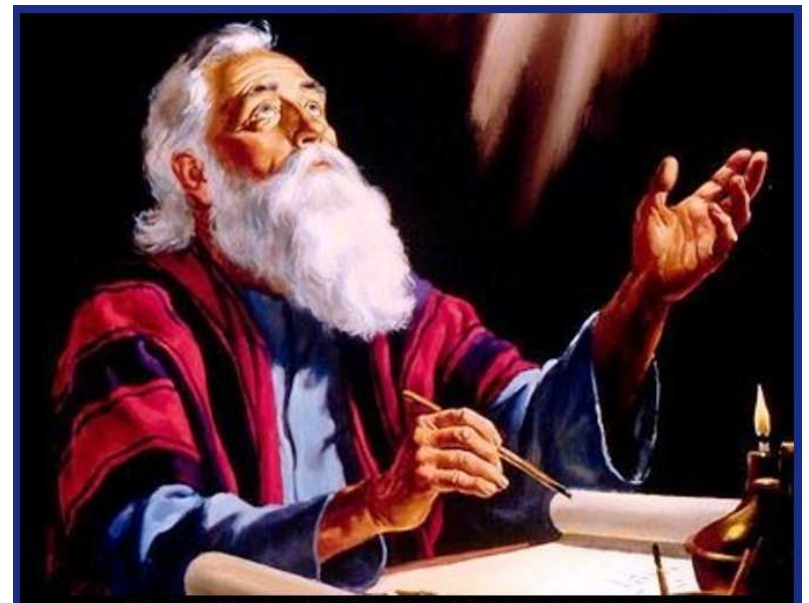
0% of the **Bible** is **man's own idea** that **man chose** to make.

(2 Peter 1:21) ...*but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost.*

Men (*God's prophets*) made the **Bible** as God's Spirit guided (*inspired*) them.

“moved” = “inspired”


God used different men to put His exact Words in the Bible.

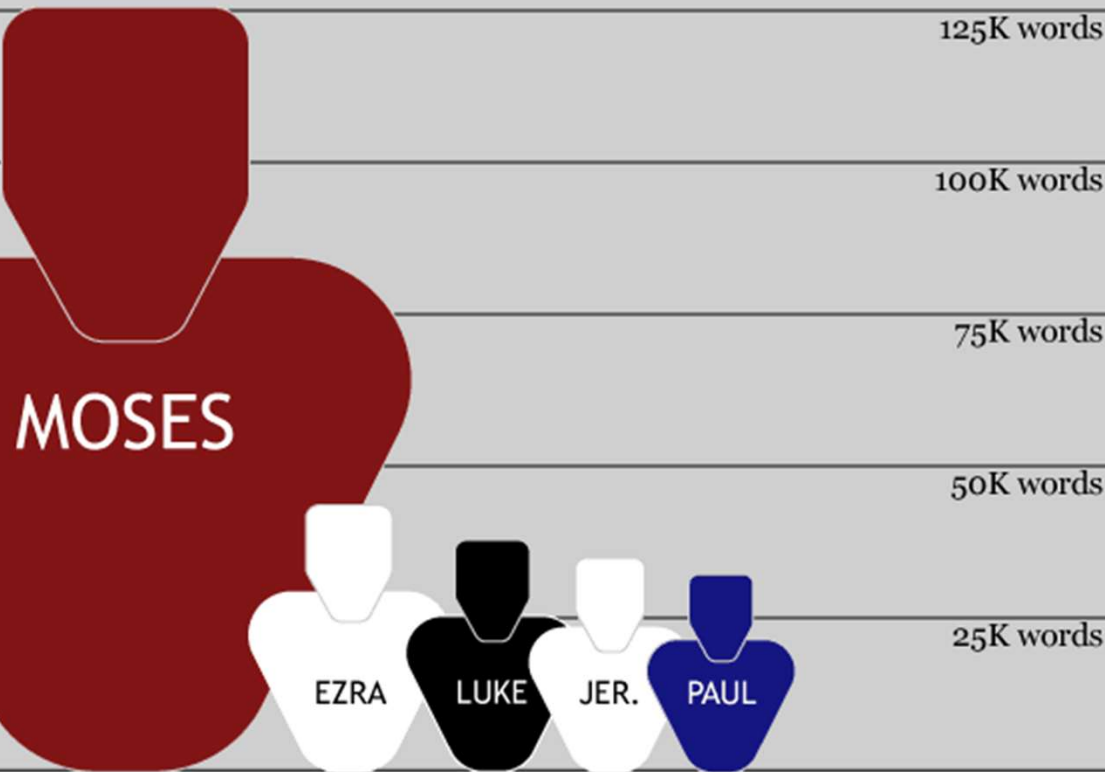

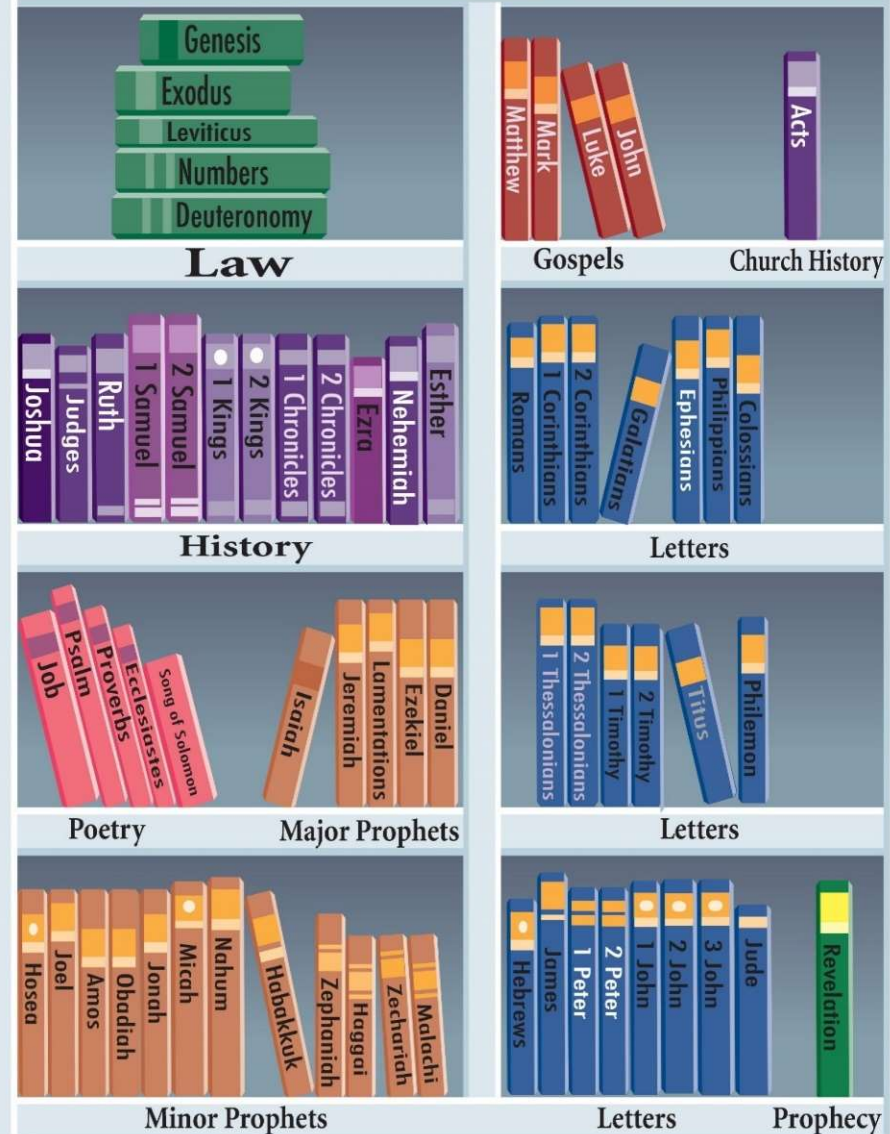
By word count in original languages:



Moses wrote about 20% of the Bible—he wins by word count. Paul wrote the most individual documents, though: 13 letters. Ezra, Luke, and Jeremiah round out the top five.

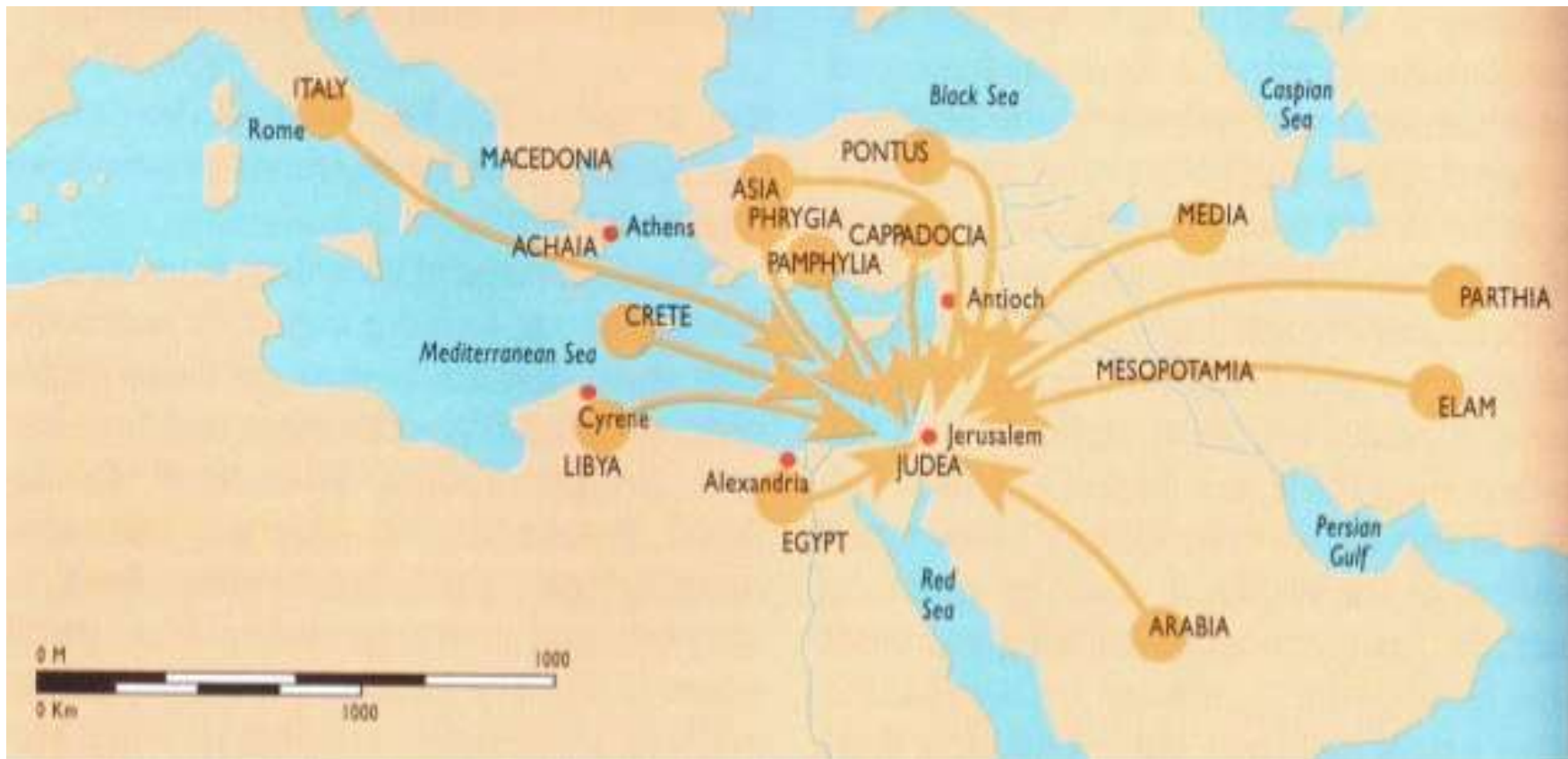

KJV = Faith / Confidence



Who is Jesus?

Jesus is God.

(1 Timothy 3:16)

(KJV) = “**God** was manifest **in the flesh**”

(NIV) = “**He** appeared in the flesh”

(ERV) = “**Christ** was shown to us in human form”

Who is Jesus?

Jesus is an equal Person of the Trinity.

(1 John 5:7)

KJV = “For there are three that bear record in heaven, the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost: and **these three are one.**”

NIV = “There are three that testify”

ERV = “So there are three witnesses that tell us about Jesus:”

Who is Jesus?

Jesus is the Son of God.

(Luke 2:33)

KJV = “And **Joseph** and his mother marvelled at those things which were spoken of him.”

NIV = “**The child’s father** and mother marveled at what was said about him.”

ERV = “**Jesus’ father** and mother were amazed at what Simeon said about him.”

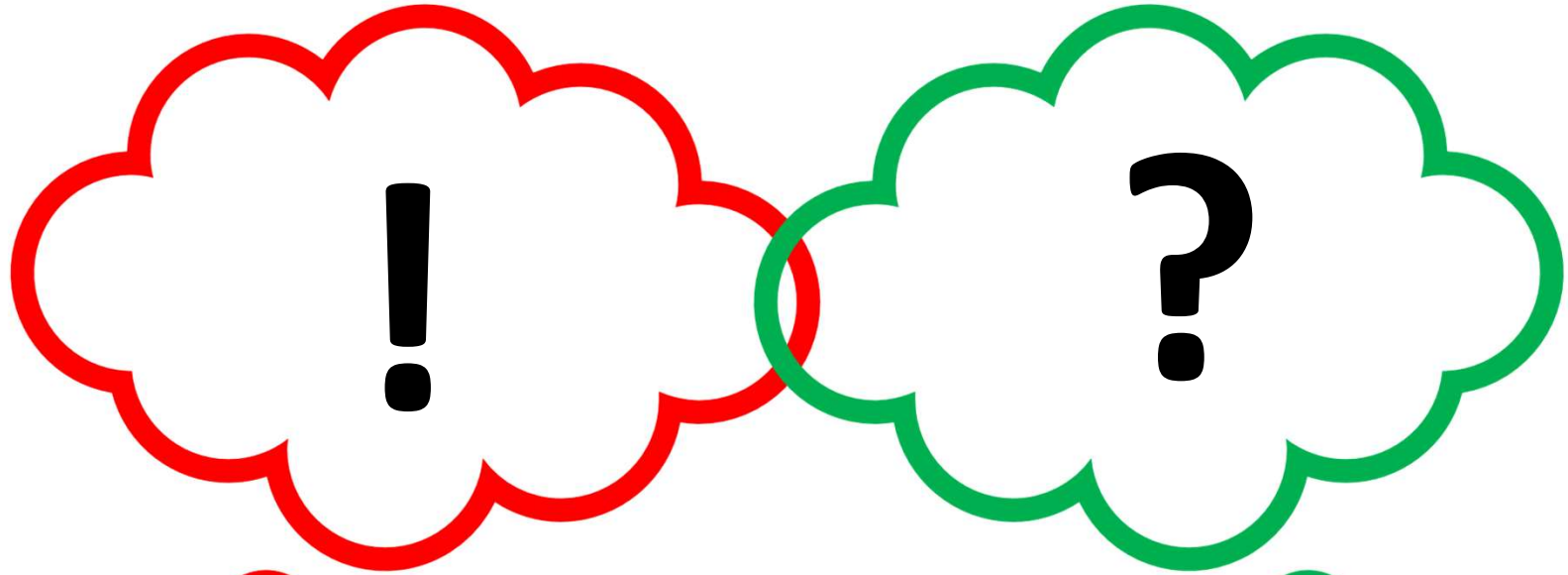

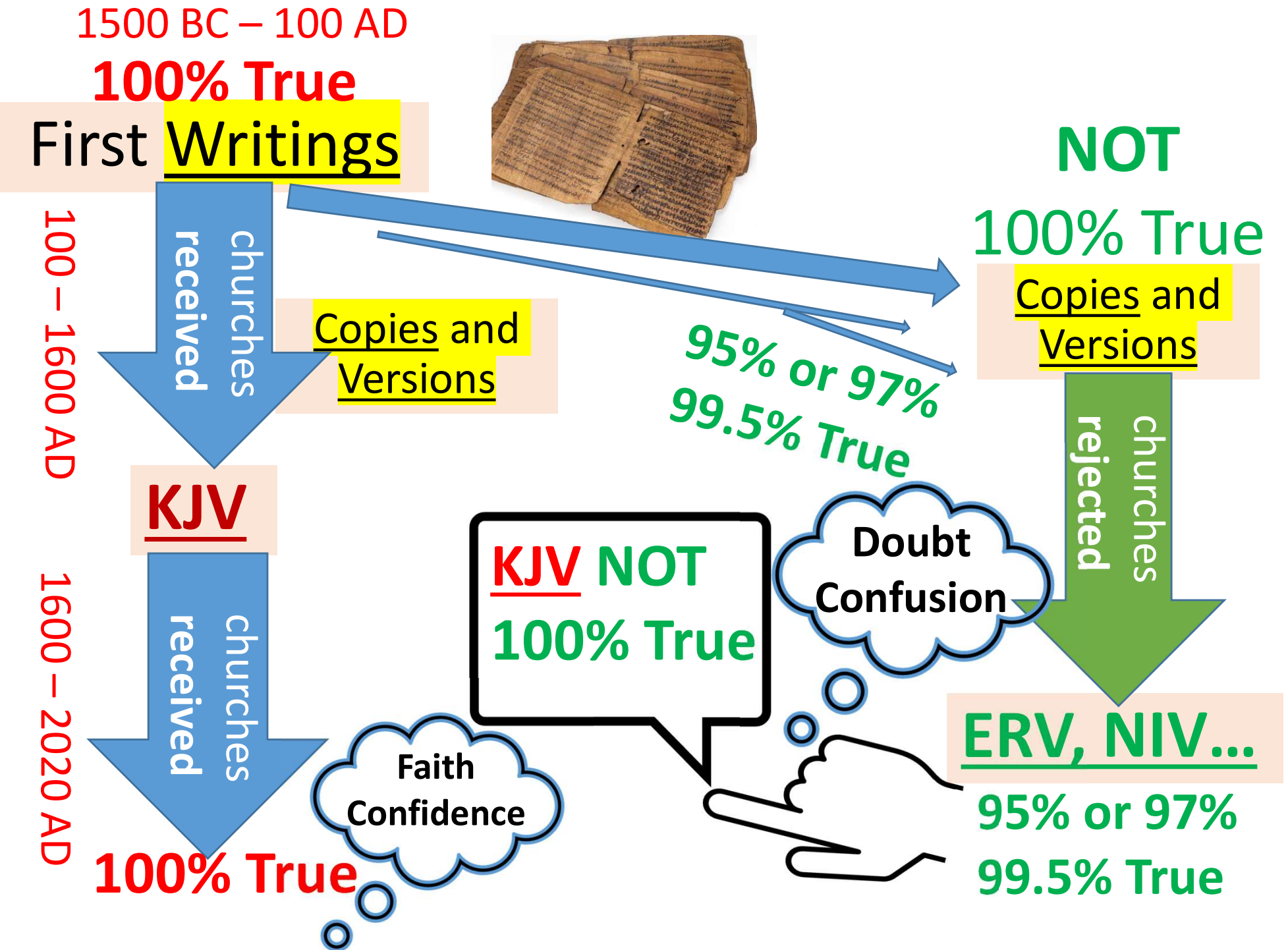

Many antichrists attacked the Bible.



Apostle John: "Even now [70AD] are there many antichrists [Satan's liars and lies]... They went out from us, but they were not of us... He is antichrist [Satan's], that denieth the Father and the Son [Trinity]... every spirit that confesseth not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh [Trinity] is not of God: and this is that spirit of antichrist [Satan's], whereof ye have heard that it [Satan's] should come; and even now [70AD] already is it [Satan's] in the world." (1 John 2:18-19; 4:3)

antichrists = attack Jesus Christ

Apostle John: "Even now [70AD] are there many antichrists [Satan's]... They went out from us, but they were not of us... He is antichrist [Satan's], that denieth the Father and the Son [Trinity]... every spirit that confesseth not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh [Trinity] is not of God: and this is that spirit of antichrist [Satan's], whereof ye have heard that it [Satan's] should come; and even now [70AD] already is it [Satan's] in the world." (1 John 2:18-19; 4:3)

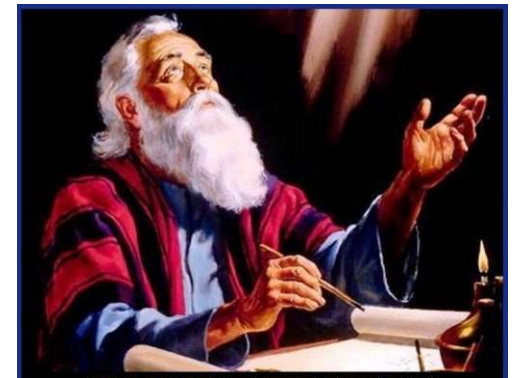

Paul showed 100% of Bible is true:

*“He saith **not**, And to **seeds**, as of many; but as of one, And to thy **seed**, which is Christ.”*

~Galatians 3:16 [Gen. 17:7-8]

“seeds” = children

“seed” = child (Jesus Christ)

Jesus showed 100% of Bible is true:

*“God spake unto him, saying, **I am** the God of Abraham, and the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob? He is **not** the God of the dead [**was = before**], but the God of the living [**am = now**]: ye therefore do greatly err.”*

~Mark 12:26-27 [Ex. 3:6]

God has revealed Himself to us by giving Himself many names.



God has revealed Himself to us by giving His **Only Begotten Son, Jesus**—**the Word**. *And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.* (John 1:14)

The **Word Made Flesh, Jesus**, is given a name above every name. (Phil. 2:9-10)

God has revealed Himself to us by giving us His **written Word**, the **Bible**.

Through God's **written Word**, the **Bible**, we learn all about God, His names, and Jesus. Without the **Bible**, we cannot know God.

Therefore, "*Thou hast magnified **thy word** above all thy name.*"

(Psalms 138:2b)

God Has Magnified His Words and will preserve His Words so that every generation may know Him.

The words of the LORD are pure words: as silver tried in a furnace of earth, purified seven times. (7) Thou shalt keep them, O LORD, thou shalt preserve them from this generation for ever. (Psalms 12:6-7)

Old Testament

Genesis tells about the **Beginning** of the world, man, sin, God's salvation plan, and the Israelite nation.



Moses wrote the **first 5 books** in the O.T. These books are named the **Law**.

The next part of the O.T. tells about the **history of Israel** and how God revealed Himself to them, guided them, protected them, punished them and restored them.



The last book in the O.T. was written by the Prophet **Malachi**.

Malachi was written 400 years before Jesus' birth in Bethlehem.



New Testament

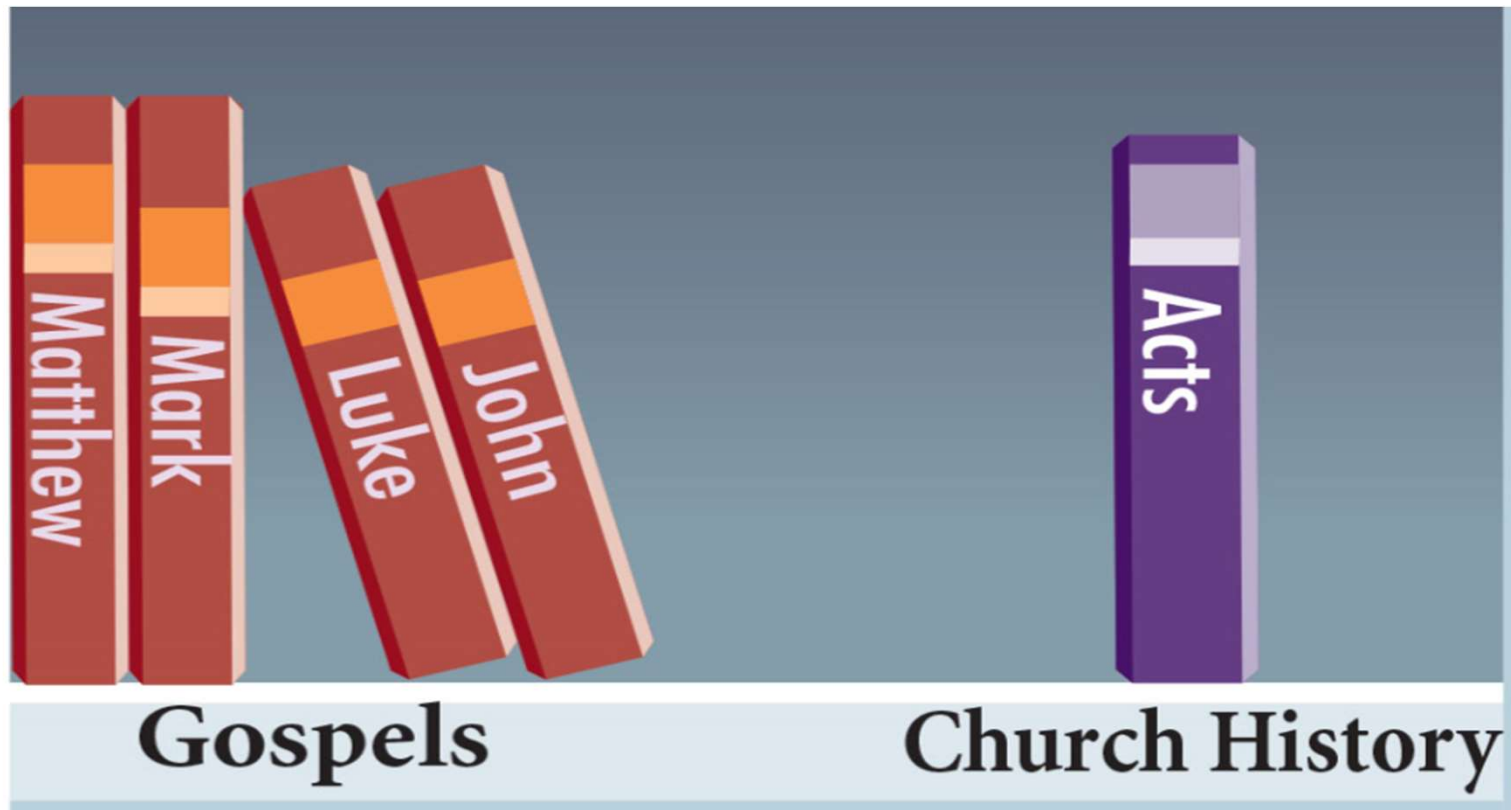
-The first 4 books were written by **Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.**

--They are four witnesses that tell about Jesus' life, death, resurrection, and ascension.

--These books are called the **Gospels** (**good news**) because they tell the story of Jesus.



- After the Gospels is the book of **Acts**.
 - Acts** tells about the work of the **apostles** of Jesus and the spread and growth of the **churches** after Jesus ascended into Heaven.



-After Acts are the **Epistles (letters)** written to different pastors, believers, and churches that we learn about in the book of Acts.
