Lesson 11 God Is Sovereign over the Nation of Israel's Past, Present, and Future.

(Romans 9-11)

1. Paul Was Sad Because Israel Rejected Jesus Christ.



(Rom. 9:2) ... I (Paul) have great heaviness and continual sorrow (sad) in my heart... (3) for my brethren, my kinsmen (family) according to the flesh: (4) Who are Israelites;


Jewish Christians were confused:

God made wonderful promises to the nation of Israel, but they rejected God's Son. What would now happen to the nation of Israel?

(Rom. 9:31) But Israel, which followed after the law of righteousness, hath not attained (got) to the law of righteousness. (32) Wherefore? (why?) Because they (Israel) sought it not by **faith**, but as it were by the works of the law. For they stumbled (fell) at that stumblingstone (Jesus—faith alone in Him);

Israel was proud (own works)

Israel was not humble (faith in Jesus)



(Rom. 10:1) Brethren, my (Paul's) heart's desire (want) and prayer to God for Israel is, that they might be saved. (2) For I bear them record (tell) that they have a zeal (much focus) of God, but not according to knowledge. (3) For they being **ignorant** (not know) of God's righteousness, and going about (try) to establish (make) their own righteousness, have not submitted (obey) themselves unto the righteousness of God (Jesus—faith alone).

(Rom. 10:4) For Christ is the end (completion/goal) of the law for righteousness to every one that believeth.

God's way of salvation never changes.

(John 14:6) Jesus saith unto him, **I am the way**, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.

2. God Has Sovereign (King—control) Right to Choose Whom He Wants to Use to Accomplish (work finish) His Will.



God is **Sovereign** (King—control/power).

Jewish Christians: Why now will God use the Church (Gentiles); why not Nation of Israel?

(Rom. 9:20) ...man, who art thou that repliest (speak) against God? Shall the thing formed (made) say to him (God) that formed (made) it, Why hast thou made me thus (this way)? (21) Hath not the potter **power** over the clay...?

God is Sovereign.


"Hath not the **potter** (God) <u>**power</u>** over the **clay** (man)...?"</u>


God chose Isaac—not Ishmael
God chose Isaac—not Esau
God chose Israel—not Egypt
God chose David—not Saul

God Chose Israel to Accomplish His Will.



(Rom. 9:4) ...to whom (Israel) pertaineth (have) the adoption (belong to God), and the glory, and the covenants (agreement), and the giving of the law, and the service of God (Tabernacle...), and the promises (Jesus will come through Israel; Israel will rule the nations);





















Now, God chose believing Gentiles/Jews (The Church) to accomplish His Will.

(Rom. 9:30) ...the Gentiles (nations), which followed not after righteousness, have attained (got) to righteousness, even the righteousness which is of faith.



3. God Chose to <u>Stop</u> Using the Nation of <u>Israel</u>. God Chose to <u>Start</u> Using Believing Gentiles/Jews (The <u>Church</u>).



Who are God's true children?

(Rom. 9:8) They which are the children of the flesh (Jews), these are not the children of God: but the children of the promise (those not flesh—but by God's

foreknowledge —those believing God) are counted (decided—yes) for the seed (children of God).

God's Children = Those believing God

(Rom 9:23) And that he (God) might make known the riches of his glory on the vessels (clay/people) of mercy, which he (God) had afore (past time) prepared unto glory, (24) Even us (church), whom (church) he (God) hath called, not of the Jews only, but also of the Gentiles?

God's Children



(The **Church**—both Jews and Gentiles)

(Rom 9:25) As he (God) saith also in Osee (Hosea), I (God) will call them (Church) my people, which (Gentiles) were not my people (Israel); and her beloved (Church), which (Gentiles) was not beloved (Israel). (26) And it shall come to pass (happen)... they (Church) be called the children of the living God.

God's Children

(The **Church**—both Jews and Gentiles)

(Rom. 10:21) But to Israel he (God) saith, All day long I have stretched forth (open) my hands unto a disobedient and gainsaying (argue/rebellious) people.

Israel rejected God's salvation (Jesus).



4. In the Future, God Will Again Use the Nation of Israel.



(Rom. 11:1) ... Hath God cast away (rejected) his people? God forbid (no!).
(2) God hath not cast away his people which he foreknew (before know).

God has **NOT** forever rejected Israel.



"All Israel shall be saved"

(Rom 11:25) ...that blindness in part (some) is happened to Israel, until the fulness of the Gentiles be come in (God's work among the Gentiles through the Church is completed). (26) And so all Israel shall be saved...

Isaiah wrote about Israel's future salvation.

(Rom. 11:33) O the depth (deep—[much]) of the riches both of the wisdom and knowledge of God! how unsearchable (infinite) are his judgments, and his ways past finding out (infinite)! (34) For who hath known the mind of the Lord? or who hath been his counsellor (teacher)?



(35) Or who hath first given to him (God), and it shall be recompensed (paid) unto him again? (36) For of him (God), and through him (God), and to him (God), are all things: to whom be glory for ever. Amen.
