



# 1. Paul Was Thankful for the Church in Rome.



#### Paul thanked God for church in Rome.

(Romans 1:8) First, I **thank** my God through Jesus Christ **for you all**, that your faith is spoken of (about) throughout (in) the whole world.



### Church in Rome was a good witness.

(Romans 1:8) First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for you all, that your faith is spoken of (about) throughout the whole world.



#### Paul prayed for church in Rome.

(Romans 1:9) For God is my witness, whom I serve with my spirit in the gospel of his Son, that without ceasing (stop) I make mention (speak) of you always in my prayers;

\*We also must pray for churches everywhere.

#### Paul wanted to visit the church in Rome.

(Romans 1:10) Making request (ask/prayer), if by any means (possible way) now at length (much time) I might have a prosperous (good) journey (travel) by the will of God to come unto you.

Paul later went to Rome as a prisoner.

### Paul wanted to strengthen the church.

(1:11) For I long (want) to see you, that I may impart (give/share) unto you some spiritual gift, to the end (goal) ye may be established (made strong);

Paul was devoted (given) to the work of preaching God's Word... to make Christians' faith stronger.

(12) That is, that I (Paul) may be comforted together with you by the mutual (share) faith both of you and me.

Paul knew that the Christians would encourage his faith also.

Christians need each other.



### (illus. sticks together in a fire burn well; stick alone ends the fire)



"mutual (share) faith" —shared faith burns brighter-

# 2. Paul Was Dedicated (given) to the Work of Spreading the Gospel.




(Romans 1:14) *I am debtor* (must give) both to the Greeks, and to the Barbarians; both to the wise, and to the unwise. (15) So, as much as in me is, *I am ready to preach the gospel* to you that are at Rome also.

Jesus gave Paul **something** => Gospel that belonged to everyone.

(illus.: famine & food or sick & healing We must not withhold the best thing)

# 3. God's <u>Power</u> and <u>Righteousness</u> Is Revealed in the Gospel.



(Romans 1:16) For I am <u>not</u> ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it (Gospel) is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek.





### Ashamed


(Isaiah 52:14) As many were astonied (Wow! Yuck! Shock!) at thee (Jesus); his visage (body) was so (much) marred (destroyed) more than any man...

"gospel of Christ" = Jesus died for our sins, was buried, and rose again on the third day. [1 Cor. 15:1-4]



\*Paul had seen the power of the Gospel in his own life and in the lives of thousands.

### "salvation to every one that believeth"

(Acts 16:30) ... what must I do to be saved? (31) And they said, **Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ**, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house.

### (Rom 1:16) "to the Jew first, and also to the Greek"


- \*God chose **Abraham** and Israel
  \*God sent **prophets** through Israel
  \***Jesus** was born in Israel
  \*The **apostles**, from Israel, first told Israel
  \***Paul** always first entered the **synagogues**(Jews church) to preach the gospel.
- --After Israel rejected the gospel, the gospel was preached to the Gentiles (Greek)

### The Gospel shows how God can stay perfectly righteous and accept sinners who believe.


(Romans 1:17) For therein (gospel) is **the**<u>righteousness</u> of God revealed (show)



God must say, "Sin = wrong."


God must punish sin.




# God killed an animal to teach how Adam and Eve could be acceptable (good) by Him.

our sins.





(Rom. 1:17) "from faith to faith: as it is written, The just (right people) shall live by faith"



### Justification (make right)

God makes us right/acceptable to Him

- \*God sent Jesus into the world to save us
- \*God **put our sins** on <u>Jesus</u>
- \*God punished Jesus for our sins
- \*God raised Jesus from the dead
- \*God taught us about our sin and led us to put our <u>faith in Jesus</u> alone for salvation.

# God made us acceptable to Him through Jesus.

In **Adam's family** we were unacceptable (not good) to God.

In **Christ's family** we are fully acceptable (good) to God.

God accepts us in the righteousness of the Lord Jesus Christ.
