

1. Heaven's Door



(Rev 4:1) After this [John] looked, and, behold, a door was opened in heaven: and the first voice (Jesus) which I heard was as it were of a trumpet talking with me; which said, Come up [Rapture] hither (here—Heaven), and I will shew thee things which must be hereafter (future).


- *Only Jesus can open Heaven's Door—He is THE Door.
- *Only Jesus can call us up to Heaven; He will Rapture His Church.
- *Only Jesus can show us the future.

(1) ...Come up [Rapture] <u>hither</u> (here), and I will shew thee things which must be <u>hereafter</u> (future).

(Rev 4:2) And <u>immediately</u> (quick) (John) was <u>in the spirit</u> [NOT body / physical—a Vision]...

- *The future events now shown begin after the Rapture. And, like the Rapture, John is called up by the voice of Jesus. But unlike the Rapture, John only goes "in spirit" and not physically.
- *During the real Rapture, our bodies will be "changed", and we'll go to Heaven having both body and spirit (1 Cor. 15:51-53).

2. Heaven's Throne



(Rev 4:2) And immediately was in the spirit: and, behold, a throne was set in heaven, and one sat on the throne. (3) And he that sat was to look upon like a jasper (colour) and a sardine (colour) stone: and there was a rainbow round about the throne, in sight like







(Rev 4:4) And round about the throne were <u>four and</u> <u>twenty</u> (24) seats: and upon the seats I saw four and twenty <u>elders</u> (believers) sitting, clothed in white <u>raiment</u> (clothes); and <u>they</u> had on <u>their</u> heads crowns

of gold.



(Rev 4:5) And out of the throne proceeded lightnings and thunderings and voices: and there were seven lamps of fire burning before the throne, which are the seven Spirits of God. (6) And before the throne there was a sea of glass like unto crystal (clear stone)...





Rev 4:6-8 ...and in the midst of the throne, and round about the throne, were four <u>beasts</u> (creatures—like angels) full of eyes before and behind. (7) And the first beast was like a lion, and the second beast like a calf, and the third beast had a face as a man, and the fourth beast was like a flying eagle. (8) And the four beasts had each of them six wings about him; and they were full of eyes within...

*"Eyes" = knowledge / wisdom

3. Heaven's Worship



(Rev 4:8) And the four beasts had each of them six wings about him; and they were full of eyes within: and they rest not day and night, saying, **Holy**, **holy**, **holy**, **Lord God Almighty**, **which was**, and **is**, and **is to come**. (9) And when those beasts give glory and honour and thanks to him that sat on the throne, who liveth for ever and ever...

(Rev 4:10) The four and twenty (24) elders fall down before him that sat on the throne, and worship him that liveth for ever and ever, and cast their crowns before the throne, saying, (11) Thou art worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honour and power: for thou hast created all things, and for thy pleasure (enjoy) they are and were created.

47. The Old Rugged Cross

So I'll cherish the old rugged cross, Till my trophies at last I lay down; I will cling to the old rugged cross And exchange it someday for a crown.



4. The Seven Sealed Scroll



(Rev 5:1) And [John] saw in the right hand of him that sat on the throne a <u>book</u> (scroll) written <u>within</u> (inside) and on the <u>backside</u> (outside), <u>sealed</u> (lock) with

seven seals.



(Rev 5:2) And I saw a strong angel <u>proclaiming</u> (shout) with a loud voice, Who is <u>worthy</u> (good) to open the book, and to loose (open) the seals <u>thereof</u> (the book)?



(Rev 5:3) And no man in heaven, nor in earth, neither under the earth, was able to open the book, neither to look <u>thereon</u> (on the book). (4) And wept much, because no man was found worthy (good) to open and to read the book, neither to look thereon.



For Whose pleasure were all things created?
For Whose glory were all things created?
Who alone <u>redeemed</u> (buy / saved) all creation?
Who alone can rule over all?

5. The Hero of Heaven



(Rev 5:5) And one of the elders saith unto me (John), Weep not: behold, the Lion of the tribe (family) of Juda, the Root (Son) of David, hath prevailed (win) to open the book, and to loose (open) the seven seals

thereof.




(Rev 5:6) And I beheld (saw), and, <u>lo</u> (looked), in the midst of the throne and of the four beasts, and in the midst of the <mark>elders</mark>, stood a <mark>Lamb</mark> as <mark>it</mark> had b<u>een slain</u> (killed), having seven horns [perfect power] and seven eyes [perfect wisdom], which are the seven Spirits of God sent forth into all the earth. (7) And he came and took the book out of the right hand of him that sat upon the throne.

Seven = perfect / complete

Horns = power

Eyes = wisdom

6. Worthy Is the Lamb



(Rev 5:8) And when he had taken the book, the four beasts and four and twenty elders fell down before the Lamb, having every one of them harps, and golden vials (bowls) full of odours (smell), which are the

prayers of saints.



(Rev 5:9) And they sung a new song, saying, Thou art worthy to take the book, and to open the seals thereof: for thou wast slain, and hast redeemed (buy / save) us to God by thy blood out of every kindred (family), and tongue (language), and people, and nation; (10) And hast made us unto our God kings and priests: and we shall reign (rule) on the earth.

Jesus alone saved us and with Jesus alone we are exalted.



(Rev 5:11) And I beheld, and I heard the voice of many angels round about the throne and the beasts and the **elders**: and the number of **them** was ten thousand times ten thousand, and thousands of thousands (10,00,00,000+ [+10 crores / +100 million]); (12) Saying with a loud voice, Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power, and riches, and wisdom, and strength, and honour, and glory, and blessing.

Only <mark>Jesus</mark> is Ruler and Owner of all.

Jesus is King of Kings and Lord of Lords.



(Rev 5:13) And every creature which is in heaven, and on the earth, and under the earth, and such as are in the sea, and all that are in them, heard I saying, Blessing, and honour, and glory, and power, be unto him that sitteth upon the throne, and unto the Lamb for ever and ever. (14) And the four beasts said, Amen. And the four and twenty elders fell down and worshipped him that liveth for ever and ever.

For eternity, Jesus will be worshipped—shown by all to be worthy.
