


1. Joshua




(Numbers 27:22-23)

Moses died outside of Canaan in Moab.




(Joshua 1:1-2)

Joshua obeyed God and led Israel to take Canaan.
*God helped Israel to conquer 30 kingdoms.






(Joshua 23:15-16)

Joshua told Israel that in the future Israel would forsake God and worship idols and God would punish them.

*God knows the future.




2. Israel's Judges (rulers).



(Judges 2:8-13)

After Joshua, Israel forsook God and worshipped idols (false gods—Baal and Ashtaroth).

*God was very angry against Israel.




(Judges 2:14)

Because God was angry at Israel's idolatry,

God punished Israel.

God allowed other nations to hurt Israel and make them slaves.



(Judges 2:16, 18)

Because God had a plan now and future for Israel, God protected Israel by giving them **Judges** who often saved Israel from their enemies.


Some of Israel's Judges were **Gideon** and **Samson**.




Gideon

- **1. Bible**—truth for all the nations.
- **2. Jesus**—salvation for all the nations.



The Judges ruled Israel for 400 years. **Samuel** was the last judge (ruler) of Israel.




(Judges 2:16-19)


Again and again Israel rebelled against God and worshipped idols.

*Again and again God punished Israel.

*Again and again Israel repented of their idolatry.

*Again and again God forgave their sins and blessed them.





(1 Samuel 8:1-7)


Israel had no king; God was Israel's king.

*Israel did not want God as king; Israel wanted a man for king—same as other nations.

*Israel told Samuel to choose a king for them.

*God allowed Israel to have a king as they wanted and told Samuel to choose Saul for Israel's king.

3. King Saul




(1 Samuel 11:15)

Samuel anointed **Saul** to be Israel's first king.


(1 Samuel 13:13-14)
Saul disobeyed God.

(1 Samuel 13:13-14)

God rejected Saul and chose David to be Israel's king.




4. King David



(1 Samuel 16:12-13)


Samuel anointed **David**the son of Jesse from
the tribe of Judah from
the city of Bethlehem
to be Israel's king.



(2 Samuel 5:2-4)

Before David became king of Israel, God was blessing **David**.

God helped David to defeat the Philistine giant named **Goliath**.




(2 Samuel 7:12-15)


God promised that David's son (Solomon) would build the temple.

(2 Samuel 7:16)

God promised that David's son (Jesus) would rule forever.




5. King Solomon




(1 Chronicles 29:28)
After David died,
Solomon ruled Israel.

(2 Chronicles 2:1)
Solomon built God's **Temple** in Jerusalem.



The **Temple** and **Tabernacle** were the same.


(2 Chronicles 7:1-2) God's glory filled the Temple.




(2 Chronicles 7:3)

*When all the people saw God's glory, they worshipped God and knew God was with them in the Temple.

*The priests offered sacrifices to God at the Temple for the people.



6. Israel and Judah




After Solomon's death, Israel was divided. (Southern Kingdom = **Judah**)



(Northern Kingdom = Israel)



Judah's kings = some bad; some good



Israel's kings = all bad
