



1. Paul Wrote a Letter to the Corinthian Church.








Paul stayed in Corinth for 1 ½ years.



Paul's Answers Guided by the Holy Spirit.



Paul was asked some questions and heard about some problems from the Corinthian church.

[1 Cor. 1:10-11; 7:1]

2. Paul Greets the Church in Corinth.




(1 Corinthians 1:1) Paul, called to be an apostle of Jesus Christ through the will of God, and Sosthenes our brother,

- "called" = given a job/office
- "apostle" = messenger / prophet of Jesus
- iii ii

- "will of God" = God's plan
- Sosthenes = another servant of Jesus
- —Paul always worked with other Christians—training them—encouraging one another.

(1 Corinthians 1:2) Unto the church of God which is at Corinth, to them that are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, with all that in every place call upon the name of Jesus Christ our Lord, both theirs (their Lord) and ours (our Lord):

- "sanctified" = separated (church)
- "called" = given a job/office
- "saints" = holy people / separate people
- This letter is to all churches / Christians




(1 Corinthians 1:3) **Grace** be unto you, and peace, from **God our Father**, and from the **Lord Jesus Christ**.

God wants us to enjoy His grace (blessings—good gifts) and to enjoy His peace.



3. Paul Thanked God for His Grace, Gifts, and Faithfulness to the Corinthian Church.



(1 Corinthians 1:4) I thank my God always on your behalf (for you), for the grace of God which is given you by Jesus Christ;

*God's blessings were given to the Corinthian church because of Jesus' death and resurrection.

(1 Corinthians 1:5) That in every thing ye are enriched (made rich) by him (God), in all utterance (speaking/teaching), and in all knowledge (learning);

[Eph. 4:7, 11-16] God has given gifts (apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors, teachers) to teach the Church so they can spiritually grow

and be strong.

(1 Corinthians 1:6) Even as the testimony of Christ (Gospel) was confirmed (proven and accepted as true) in you: (7) So that ye come behind (miss) in no gift (grace); waiting for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ:

*We are excited for Jesus to quickly come...

Jesus is all our hope.

But to each one of us grace was given according to the

measure of Christ's gift.

(1 Corinthians 1:8) Who (God) shall also confirm (keep) you unto the end (...of life on earth), that ye may be blameless (perfect) in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ.

- [Rom. 8:1, 28-39] Nothing can separate us from God's love; It is God that has justified us; no one can condemn us.
- Judgment Seat of Christ—after the Rapture



(1 Corinthians 1:9) God is faithful, by whom (God) ye were called unto the fellowship (share/join) of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord.


- *God's will does not change. God always keeps His promises/Word.
- God's will/plan
- *All that Jesus Christ has is shared with us.

4. The Corinthian Church Must End Divisions.




(1 Corinthians 1:10) Now I beseech (beg) you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye all speak the same thing (teaching), and that there be no divisions (separation) among you; but that ye be perfectly joined together (100% unity) in the same mind (thinking) and in the same judgment (decisions).

*Unity in right teaching.



(1 Corinthians 1:11) For it hath been declared (told) unto me of you, my brethren, by them which are of the house (family) of Chloe, that there are contentions (argue/fight) among you.



(12) Now this I say, that every one of you saith, I am of Paul; and I of Apollos; and I of Cephas (Peter); and I of Christ.



Dividing the Body



(1 Corinthians 1:13) *Is Christ divided?* [No!] was *Paul crucified for you?* [No!] or were ye baptized in the name of Paul? [No!]

*[Eph. 4:4-6] There is One Body... One Lord... One

Faith (Gospel/Bible)... One Baptism...



*[Mat. 28:19] We are not baptized in the name of Paul or any man; we are baptized in the name of Jesus.

(1 Corinthians 1:14) I thank God that I (Paul) baptized none of you, but (except / only) Crispus and Gaius; (15) Lest (so not) any should say that I had baptized in mine own name. (16) And I baptized also the household (family) of Stephanas: besides (other), I know not whether (if) I baptized any other.

*Baptism announces a disciple of Jesus, not of Paul.

^{**}We follow Jesus' teaching in the New Testament.

5. Paul Depended Not on Man's Wisdom; Paul Depended on the Gospel.



(1 Corinthians 1:17) For Christ sent me (Paul) not to baptize, but to preach the gospel: not with wisdom of words, lest (so not) the cross of Christ should be made of none effect (no importance).

- *Baptism doesn't save; baptism makes disciples.
- *The Gospel saves.
- *Man's ideas or beautiful speaking
- *Jesus died for our sins.

(1 Corinthians 1:18) For the preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness; but unto us which are saved it is the power of God.

- *Proud and unrepentant people of this world will laugh at the Gospel.
- **But we know faith in the Gospel is the only way for salvation [Rom. 1:16].
